IESL Credo

2. Brig Inder Mohan Singh, President IESL, read out the IESL Credo which was followed by observing two minutes silence by all the members to pay homage to the departed souls.

Welcome Address

3. Brig Inder Mohan Singh, President IESL accorded a warm welcome to the Presidents State Leagues, Council Members, Delegates from all States and common members as special invitees who had come to attend the proceedings of the house during the AGM.

Preliminary Proceedings

4. Thereafter the President IESL declared the AGM open. The President said that the last AGM was held on 20 Nov 2024 and this AGM is for the year 2024-25. The President averred that in the AGM basically five main issues are covered i.e. interaction with the delegates, President's speech (Annual Report), Audit Report of Accounts and perusal of accounts by all, Agenda points from State Leagues and Senior Veterans to be given an opportunity to speak to the house. It has been informed that Annual Report alongwith various activities / initiatives and actions taken by HQ IESL are placed in the folder for each delegate for perusal.

5. President Rajasthan Ex-Services League raised the issue of removal of Brig OP Yadav, YSM (Retd) as Vice President (Nominated) and termination of his membership. He insisted that Brig Yadav, YSM (Retd) should have been given an opportunity to present his side. Brig Inder Mohan Singh, President IESL explained that Para 52 does not envisage for "No Confidence Motion". Para 51 only authorises the President to convene EOGM. However Brig OP Yadav, YSM (Retd) Nominated Vice President, in connivance with few others resorted to convene EOGM which amounts to a coup attempt to destabilise the institution. The President by using instruments of necessity removed him of the appointment and his membership. In addition, Brig OP Yadav, YSM (Retd) then nominated VP made false claims of travel from residence to office in 72 trips that he made. As per the rules in vogue Travel Allowance by own car or taxi is permitted at the rate of Rs 12 per KM. His residence is 32 KM one way. If he travelled by car / taxi he was entitled to Rs 768. He however mostly travelled by his personal car upto the nearest Dwarka Metro Station, then by metro to Dhaula Kuan and brought to the IESL office by the IESL car and returned the same way. It is thus evident that he claimed in excess despite the fact that he was aware of the rules on the subject. Further more he has been staying in Haryana and is holding the membership of Delhi contrary to the membership policy.

6. 14 EC members out of 15 agreed with this issue of termination of his appointment of nominated Vice President (HQ) and termination of his primary membership. Hence on grounds of lack of moral turpitude as mentioned in Para 13 (e) of Bye Laws he was removed as nominated VP (HQ) and his primary membership was terminated.

7. President, Rajasthan Ex-Services League enquired about the status of General Secretary and suggested that the incumbent be made permanent and a fixed honorarium and attend the office throughout the week. The President informed the house that Col (Dr) KSP Singh, YSM, Interim Gen Secretary will be the Gen Secy for the balance of the tenure of the House. Since the work involved is not much he is not required to attend the office every day. Hence he will attend the office on as required basis and TA/DA will be paid to him. No salary/honorarium will be paid. This way we will save Rs 72000.00 per month.

8. **Participation of HESL.** Despite knowing that HESL has been placed under an Administrator from Nov 2025 and no election held as per schedule before that, Rajasthan and J&K Ex-Services Leagues kept insisting on their participation. HESL was not permitted to participate in any IESL meeting, EC or AGM from 2017 to 2019 when it was similarly placed under an Administrator for irregularities in membership. The Delhi Police had to be informed of this and letter of Administrator that HESL will not participate in any IESL management meeting was handed over to the police and gates were locked to prevent their entry.

9. **Termination of HESL Members.** Membership of six members of HESL who were in receipt of pay and allowance from HESL including one from Railways also was terminated. Holding an office of profit is contrary to Rule 32 of the IESL. Show Cause Notice was issued to :-

- (a) Sub Maj Vijay Pal Singh Chauhan
- (b) H/Sub Maj Jaspal Singh
- (c) H/Nb Sub Raghubir Singh
- (d) H/Sub Maj Surender Kumar Kaushik
- (e) NK Kulbir Singh Mor
- (f) WO Pawan Kumar

10. Since no satisfactory reply was received from them and no written reply was received from Administrator HESL stating they were wrongly terminated, their membership stands terminated and this is hereby proposed to be passed by the AGM. **This was passed by majority.**

11. Membership of four other office bearers of HESL was terminated viz Col RS Malik, Col TC Dahiya, H/Capt Agya Ram Dahiya and Ris Maj Sukhbir Singh Ahlawat. They had fraudulently and by way of misrepresentation made IESL party in their legal case with another group of HESL. No 'Vakalatnamma' was signed by the President. Impleaded IESL as Appellant No 2 and falsely represented President IESL in an appeal before the State Registrar (F&S) Chandigarh without permission, knowledge or notice with the intention of getting the stay order granted by the District Registrar (F&S) Rohtak vacated. It is a case, of lack of moral turpitude. IESL is now at liberty to file a criminal case against the erring members for this illegal act. **Overwhelming majority out of 80 agreed for termination of their membership. More so the House also disapproved their protest outside the Gate.**

12. **IESL UP.** As is well known IESL UP League registered at Meerut was declared illegal by the Dy Registrar, Firms, Societies and Chits, Meerut and Commissioner Meerut Division and the same was passed in the EC held on 10 Dec 2025. Maj Gen SS Ahlawat, VSM (Retd) continued to write letters as President UPESL for over six months after the declaration of the UP League as illegal. He refused to hand over the accounts to the new League. He did not inform the Delhi High Court that his legal position as President UPESL has been declared null and void by the Dy Registrar Meerut and Commissioner Meerut Division. For this the Delhi High Court came down heavily and has asked for an explanation in the next hearing. No interim order has been granted against the society cancellation order. In the absence of any interim protection the cancellation order remains fully operative and binding. Hence the Legal consequences of society cancellation are as under :-

- (a) Society ceases to have any legal existence and cannot function as legal entity.
- (b) No official communication can be lawfully initiated in its name.
- (c) No person / its affiliated organisation can act to be its office bearers.
- (d) The use of name and style of cancelled Society is totally unauthorised and illegal. Despite this clear legal position, letters have been issued to constitutional authorities using prohibited name, style, logo and appointments thus hereby creating confusion and attempting to mislead govt and officials which is derogatory to the prestige of IESL. Maj Gen SS Ahlawat, VSM (Retd) and few other individuals / its associated organisations are signing as office bearers of an entity whose recognition stands cancelled by competent authorities due to unethical and illegal functioning. Hence unauthorised use of name of a prohibited body and mis-representation before public authorities amounts to disturbing administrative functioning. This is an act / attempt to gain recognition without legal sanction.

13. **Suppression of material facts :-**

(a) The fact of cancellation of registration has not been properly disclosed at High Court Delhi.

(b) To stop him from such acts appropriate civil and criminal procedure may be initiated.

14. Maj Gen SS Ahlawat, VSM (Retd) despite this legal order came to HQ IESL on 09 March 2026 and was stopped at the Gate. Based on Orders of the two Meerut Courts, UPESL Lucknow has been restored with its earlier status. Maj Yogendra Singh Katiyar has been appointed as President of UPESL on 09 Dec 2025 and Registrar UP Lucknow and Rajya Sainik Board UP informed accordingly. His appointment is for five years within which he will add members from this largest State and UPESL will hold elections in due time. He was also appointed as VP and EC member on 10 Dec 2025 in the EC meeting. The House passed the above action against Maj Gen SS Ahlawat and the appointment of Maj Yogendra Singh Katiyar as President with overwhelming majority in a voice vote.

15. **Action against Members Filing Cases in Courts.** It has been seen that there is a new trend to file case in State Leagues and also against HQ IESL. It was proposed that membership of all such members be terminated. The house passed this proposal with overwhelming majority and any one filing a case for any reason will be removed from membership of IESL.

16. **Holding of EOGM.** It is clearly laid down in our Bye Laws Para 51, that only the President can convene an EOGM. Lt Gen RK Sharma moved a case of EOGM to move "No Confidence Motion" and it was supported by few other States. Para 52 of our Bye laws does not envisage such provision in IESL. Only amendment to Memorandum and Articles of Association can be taken up under EOGM. Despite conveying to all that EOGM could not be called by anyone except President, the notice of EOGM was sent with copy endorsed to the Registrar of Societies Delhi by Brig OP Yadav. On 31 Dec 2025 Lt Gen RK Sharma agreed to withdraw the notice of EOGM which was illegal.

17. A number of members booked their rail / air tickets for the EOGM on 09 Jan 2026 which were cancelled. Now the concerned members have to be compensated for the losses they suffered in cancellation of their air / rail tickets. This will be at the cost of those who raised the illegal call of EOGM.

18. In view of the above it was proposed by the President that in case any other State proposed an EOGM without the approval of President, they will have to deposit a sum of Rs 10 lakh which is the approximate cost for holding any such meeting.

19. **Nomination of Delegates.** It was unanimously declared by the house that the States are at liberty to elect and change the delegates within the State. There will be no interference by any other State or IESL as long as the process is followed in a transparent manner and as per the Bye-Laws of the State.

Agenda Points

20. **Agenda No 1 & 2.** Covered at Para 2, 3 and 20.

21. **Agenda No 3 – Audit of Balance Sheet for the FY 2024-25.** The President informed the house that the accounts for the year 2024-2025 have been audited by the CA and the balance sheets were sent to all the State Leagues and have also been placed in the folders given to all the delegates. There were certain queries by Lt Gen KK Repswal, President Rajasthan Ex-Services League. Lt Col Raghbir Singh, Hony Treasurer explained the balance sheet and clarified the observations thereupon. The accounts were perused by all the Veterans and the accounts were passed. Brig Antaryami Pradhan, President Orissa ESL proposed and was seconded by Col Mukhtiar Singh, Delegate Punjab and Lt Col AA Rathinam, President Kerala ESL.

22. **Agenda No 4 – Amendments in IESL Memorandum and Articles of Association.**
 (a) **Reducing the Tenure of Next Team of Office Bearers from Five Years to Three Years.** The house passed the resolution of present house for five years by majority vote. The house clarified that the resolution of tenure for three years was meant only for the next and subsequent terms. The present tenure will continue for five years as hither-to-fore. Lt Gen Rakesh Sharma, President J & K Ex-Services League proposed that States too should reduce it to 3 years as per notional policy. However, it was clarified by the house that as far as States are concerned they are at liberty to follow whatever term is decided by the respective State.
 (b) **Reducing the Notice Period of Elections from 180 Days to 90 Days.** The notice period of elections which earlier was 180 days was proposed to be reduced to 90 days in case the house reduced the terms of the present house from five to three year. Since this was rejected and the next house will be for three years, the notice period from 180 days will be reduced after going into mandatory requirements. This will be decided next year.

23. **Agenda No 5 - Utilisation of Garages after De-sealing.** The garages will continue to be used as garages only for parking. These will not be used for any commercial activity or for any other purpose.

24. **Agenda No 6 – Discussion on Points Related to 8th CPC and Disability Pension.** The point was dwelled in detail and the efforts being made were explained. The measures / steps taken to ensure status quo on disability pension were explained to the house by the President. The volunteers were asked for and a committee comprising of the following was made which would meet the 8th Army Pay Commission Cell periodically and the first meeting is scheduled on 17th Mar 2026 :-

- (a) Lt Col AA Rathinam
- (b) Maj Yogender Singh Katiyar
- (c) Sergeant Gopal Wankhede

25. **Agenda No 7 – Payment of Gratuity to Hony Capt Ratan Singh, Ex Office Supdt of IESL (Rs 3,74,462/-).** The matter has been resolved amicably and Hony Capt Ratan Singh has agreed to withdraw the said case. However, though the EC approved this, **the AGM wanted to contest the same in the Court.**

26. **Agenda No 8 – Points Received from State Leagues.**(a) **TAMILNADU**

(i) **Cash Grant of Rs 75000.00 for the State Ex-Services Leagues for Welfare of ESM.** The President announced that IESL will provide Rs 2-3 lakhs to every State depending upon the strength and size of the State. However, the States should use these funds judiciously for welfare and other activities. The States will also provide their Annual Audit Report (duly audited by an authorized CA). It was assured by the President that the corpus amount will not be touched (FDs will not be broken prematurely) and this amount and other welfare activities will be carried out from the interest generated from said FDs.

(ii) **Amendment of Para 33 of IESL Memorandum & AOA-Reconstitution of Executive Committee - Restructuring of IESL Governance Transition from Three Tier to Two Tier System.** The Societies Registration Act, 1860 does not mandate a three-tier governance structure. It recognises governance through the General Body and a Managing/Executive Committee. A two-tier structure is therefore fully compliant, simpler, transparent and efficient.

Proposed Restructuring

It is proposed that IESL transition to a two-tier system comprising the General Body (AGM) and Executive Committee (EC). The Council shall be dissolved and all its powers transferred to the Executive Committee. And all appellate power will be vested with AGM.

Resolution

Resolved that, in view of the enlarged and representative Executive Committee and to ensure streamlined, efficient, and accountable governance, the Indian Ex-Services League (IESL) shall transition from the existing three-tier governance structure to a two-tier structure consisting of the General Body (AGM) and the Executive Committee (EC).

Resolved further that the Council shall stand abolished with immediate effect and all powers, functions, duties, and responsibilities vested in the Council shall be transferred to the Executive Committee.

Resolved further that this restructuring is in conformity with the Societies Registration Act, 1860.

Resolved further that the Executive Committee is authorised to carry out necessary amendments to the Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws to give effect to this resolution. The proposal was passed unanimously and it was decided to reconstitute the Executive Committee with enhanced powers and to do away with the Governing Council. JWO KC Thakur who had been tasked to cater for the same in updation / revision of the constitution of IESL, has produced draft constitution/bye laws of IESL. The same are being forwarded to all States for their comments and suggestions.

(iii) **A State / UT League cannot Cede from the IESL but may be de-affiliated if Acting in a Manner Prejudicial to the Aims, Objectives, Rules and Regulations of IESL (Para 14 of the existing IESL Memorandum and Articles of Association).**

Para 14 of the existing Memorandum & Bye-Laws provides that an affiliated State/UT Ex-Services League cannot cede from the IESL but may be de-affiliated if acting in a manner prejudicial to the aims, objectives, rules and regulations of IESL.

It has come to notice that certain States are presently engaged in commercial or profit-oriented activities under the name of ESL, which is prejudicial to the non-profit nature, aims and objectives of IESL and contrary to the Societies Registration Act.

To ensure legal compliance, it is proposed that such States be permitted temporary secession from IESL solely for the purpose of spinning off their commercial activities into independent legal structures such as Co-operative Societies, LLPs, Trusts or Companies under the Companies Act. Once compliant, they may reapply for affiliation.

Proposed Amendment to Para 14

Proposed Para 14(a) – (New)

14(a). In cases where an affiliated State/Union Territory Ex-Services League is engaged in commercial, business, or profit-oriented activities that are not in conformity with the aims and objects, rules, and regulations of the IESL, such State/UT League may be permitted, with prior approval of the Council, to temporarily secede from the IESL solely for the purpose of restructuring or transferring such commercial activities into legally permissible entities such as Co-operative Societies, LLPs, Registered Trusts, or Companies formed under the Companies Act. After cessation of such activities under the ESL banner and completion of restructuring, the State/UT League may apply for fresh affiliation. The Council shall examine such applications and take a final decision.

Proposed Para 14(b)

14(b). An affiliated State/Union Territory Ex-Services League has the right to cede from the IESL under Para 14 (a). An affiliated State/UT shall carry out the mandates of the IESL and shall give full support and co-operation in achieving its aims and objectives. An affiliated body, which in the opinion of the Council is acting in a manner prejudicial to the aims and objectives and rules and regulations of the IESL, shall be de-affiliated. It shall, however, be given full opportunity to defend itself. The decision of the EC and AGM shall be final.

(iv) Establishment of IESL Zonal Offices in Tamilnadu and Punjab.

The proposal was turned down unanimously and status quo to be maintained. However Brig Inder Mohan Singh, President IESL has volunteered to donate 500 m of plot, in his village for Punjab ESL/ Zonal Office (If it ever comes into vogue). It will only be through a trust to safeguard against any pilferage in future.

(v) **Misinformation and Vilification on Social Media.** The house opined against spread of misinformation on a number of whatsapp groups that have been created for the same. The president exhorted the members not to get carried away by such inappropriate activities and believe only in authorized groups created by HQ IESL i.e :-

- (aa) Official Gp IESL STATE / UT Presidents.
- (ab) Delegates Official Group IESL.
- (ac) Rest of the whatsapp groups to be discontinued forthwith.

(vi) **Distribution of Delegates Based on MoD Census Data.** It was decided that all States will update their respective member lists and remove the names of all those who are no more or whose membership has been terminated within six months. The lists will contain following details :-

Name, Father's Name, Date of Birth, Address, IESL Membership No, PPO No and Mobile Number.

It is very much doubtful that the lists from 1965 can be updated. Even the manual records of that period are difficult to locate and verify. The list will be vetted and approved by IESL. As of now our election system, based on total membership since inception is wrong and illegal. It wouldn't stand any legal scrutiny if it is not done within the stipulated time frame then the figure obtained from KSB or MoD will be used for representation of State. A suggested model is as under :-

(ab) Based on the above the delegates can be decided. We can decide on 80 or 90 delegates. Only those States / UTs who have full numbers will get voting rights as delegates. Others with fractional representation will be part of the IESL without voting rights in the elections. The total strength of ESM and widows as per above figure will be taken and divided by the strength of the State. For 80 or 90 delegates, the representation will be as under :-

(b) **J&K**

(i) Efforts are already on for re-employment of ESM. A close liaison is maintained with DGR and AWPO, in addition to various civil/private entrepreneurs. A case was also mooted for lateral entry of ESM into PMF and CPO organisations. The Central Govt and various State Govts have already agreed upon left out Agniveers.

(ii) Relationship Recruitment is already in vogue at all the Regtl Centres where certain concessions are allowed in physical attributes.

(iii) Saluting without a headgear is in practice in AF and Navy. Therefore there is no merit in this point.

(iv) A committee has already been formed to provide suggestions in relation to 8th CPC. MSP and OROP have already been dwelled upon adequately at respective level of the Services and the govt.

(c) **West Bengal**

(i) Name of IESL (WB) cannot be changed in any way as West Bengal Ex-Services League as per ruling of IESL.

In view of the directions of concerned Registrar name of IESL (WB) can continue to be used.

(ii) Request for financial assistance to Smt Suju Taman wife of Late Hav Alam Yamchunger because her house was totally damaged by the land slide.

Point conceded and a cheque for Rs 50,000/- handed over to the President, IESL (WB) on the spot.

(d) **Delhi**

(i) Withdrawing and cancelling all the unconstitutional decisions taken by the President and resolution in the interest of the organization.

There was no unconstitutional / illegal decision / direction given or promulgated by the President IESL. Each and every decision has been taken after due deliberation and in conformity with the existing constitution of IESL.

(ii) All accused should be given an opportunity to represent themselves and prove their innocence. Similarly all those whose membership has been terminated, their membership should be revoked.

The President IESL informed the House that enough opportunities were given to all and actions were taken only after that. All such actions were taken only after due deliberation and in consultation with the legal authorities. Details are given at Paras 5.6, 8,9,10,11,12,13 and 14.

(e) **Ladakh.**

(i) Hony Capt Sonam Murup, President Ladakh's efforts were lauded and his work appreciated. On his request like other States all the ESM activities of Ladakh would be covered in the IESL Magazine.

(f) **Maharashtra**

(i) IESL Maharashtra has been doing a yeoman's service to the ESM through numerous activities like running schools, security services, providing guidance and coaching for the wards and children of ESM in the fields of IIT, NDA, CDS and the State President himself has been contributing to this cause through CSR.

(ii) **Termination of Membership.** It was decided by the house that anyone approaching the Court against IESL will be penalized by termination of his Membership. Objection to this point by the representatives of Rajasthan and J&K were turned down by the majority vote and the point was passed (Para 15 also refers).

(g) **Andhra Pradesh.**

(i) Far too many complaints including misappropriation of funds against Hav Reddy Srinivasa Vara Prasad were received. The incumbent President has been replaced by Nb Sub DSK Prasad. The new incumbent will hold free and fair elections in the next one year by 31 Mar 2027.

(h) **Rajasthan**

(i) Lt Gen KK Repswal objected to removal of the nominated Vice President, cancellation of membership of IESL members and de-affiliation of State League. Relevant Paragraphs of the Bye-Laws / Constitution of IESL were quoted and majority of the house declared that termination of nominated Vice President, cancellation of membership and de-affiliation of State Leagues was in order.

(ii) **The Membership Cards should also have the Mobile Number of the Individual for Ease of Interaction Among the Members.** The point was turned down for the security reason as the same could be misused in a number of ways.

(iii) **A Case be Taken up with ECHS for the Treatment of ESM Suffering from Parkinson's Disease.** The point was well taken. A case will be taken up with ECHS for the same in due course of time.

(j) **Gujarat and Kerala**

(i) States of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Kerala and Darjeeling District of Bengal were highly commended by the house for having conducted their respective AGMs in an exemplary manner.

27. **Financial Powers.** The House unanimously proposed and approved the following Financial Powers in normal circumstances for welfare measures :-

- (a) EC – Rs 10,00,000.00 (Rupees ten lakh in one session)
- (b) President - Rs 2,00,000.00 (Rupees two lakhs without referring to EC/GC)

28. A sum of Rs 10000.00 (Rupees ten thousand only) was awarded to Sub Maj (Hony Lt) S Sugumar of Tamil Nadu as a reward / incentive for having been conferred with State Achiever Award.

29. A cheque of Rs 10000.00 (Rupees ten thousand only) was presented to JWO KC Thakur (Himachal Pradesh) for having drafted the new constitution of IESL. Another Rs 10000.00 (Rupees ten thousand only) will be given to him once the said Constitution / By Laws of IESL are finally approved.

30. There being no further points the House was requested to pass a vote of thanks to the chair and all attendees. The same was done by the house unanimously and the meeting was declared closed.
